DB:PREP offers review of developmental-behavioral pediatrics

Brush up on your knowledge of developmental-behavioral pediatric medicine with a winter getaway in Atlanta. The DB:PREP course, held Dec. 4-7 at The Westin Buckhead, is designed to enhance your ability to diagnose and manage complex or difficult cases.

The course follows the outline established by the American Board of Pediatrics for the Subspecialty Certifying Examination in Developmental-Behavioral Pediatrics. It's a review for subspecialists preparing to maintain their certification or for pediatricians who plan on taking the exam for the first time.

By the end of the course, you will be better able to recognize and manage developmental-behavioral challenges across the age spectrum.
