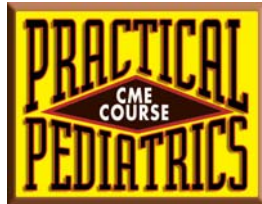
Mark summer's end with Practical Pediatrics in Chicago
