### Enjoy the view at Practical Pediatrics, Breckenridge

Hit the slopes or simply enjoy the view of the mountaintops during the Practical Pediatrics continuing medical education (CME) course Jan. 14-17 at the Beaver Run Resort & Conference Center in Breckenridge, Colo.
