professor of surgery and pediatrics at University of Illinois College of Medicine at Peoria and Chicago;

- *Behavioral Counseling: Tips for the Busy Clinician*, with Karen J. Miller, M.D., FAAP, associate professor of pediatrics at Tufts University School of Medicine, Boston;
- *Motivational Interviewing to Address Childhood Obesity and Evaluation and Management of the Child with Small Stature*, with Robert P. Schwartz, M.D., FAAP, professor of pediatrics at Wake Forest University School of Medicine, Winston-Salem, N.C.; and
- *Pediatric Oral Pathology and Syndromes*, with Rebecca L. Slayton, D.D.S., Ph.D., professor and chair of the department of pediatric dentistry at the University of Iowa College of Dentistry, Iowa City, Iowa.

General session lecture highlights include: *ADHD: Answering Parents' Questions*; *Management of Dental Emergencies*; *Atopic Dermatitis*; *Strabismus and Amblyopia for the Pediatrician*; *Type 2 Diabetes and the Metabolic Syndrome*; and *Fractures You Should Not Miss*.
