- “Environmental Emergencies,” with Ghazala Q. Sharieff, M.D., clinical professor of pediatrics at University of California San Diego and division director at Rady Children’s Hospital Emergency Care Center, San Diego;
- “Bites/Stings/Marine Envenomations,” with John M. Loiselle, M.D., FAAP, associate professor of pediatrics at Jefferson Medical College, Philadelphia, and chief of emergency medicine at Alfred I. DuPont Hospital for Children, Wilmington, Del.;
- “Orthopedic Trauma I and II,” with Gary Geis, M.D., FAAP, assistant professor of clinical pediatrics at University of Cincinnati College of Medicine, Cincinnati; and
- “Oral Maxillofacial/Dental Emergencies,” with George A. Woodward, M.D., M.B.A., FAAP, professor of pediatrics at University of Washington School of Medicine and chief of the Division of Emergency Medicine at Children’s Hospital and Regional Medical Center, Seattle.
