- "Practice Management: Medical Errors (Cases from a Children's Hospital)," with Joan E. Shook, M.D., M.B.A., FACEP, FAAP, professor of pediatrics and head of the Section of Emergency Medicine at Baylor College of Medicine, Houston;
- "Food Allergy Case Presentations: Peanut Allergy, Milk Allergy



and Atopic Dermatitis," with Laurie Smith, M.D., FAAAAI, FAAP, staff physician in the allergy department of Walter Reed Army Medical Center, Washington, D.C.; and

- "My Stomach Hurts: An Approach to the Infectious Causes of Abdominal Pain," with Jeffrey R. Starke, M.D., FAAP, professor and vice chairman of pediatrics at Baylor College of Medicine, Houston.

General session lecture topics include child abuse and neglect, medications for attention-deficit/hyperactivity disorder, an update on Kawasaki disease, and syncope in children and adolescents.
