### Denver, Chicago provide stunning backdrops for PREP courses

The Mile High City and the Windy City play host to continuing medical education courses that review child abuse pediatrics and pediatric infectious diseases.



PREP:CAP, an intensive review and update of child abuse pediatrics, will be held July 20-24 at the Westin Denver Downtown. PREP:ID, a comprehensive review and update of pediatric infectious diseases, will be held July 25-30 at the Westin Chicago River North.

Head to Denver for PREP:CAP and get a taste of urban sophistication and outdoor adventure. With 300 days of sunshine, a vibrant downtown, a thriving art and cultural scene, and the Rockies as a backdrop, the area is one of the world's most spectacular playgrounds.

PREP:CAP has two tracks. The first is designed for those preparing for the American Board of Pediatrics Subspecialty Certifying Examination in Child Abuse Pediatrics or Maintenance of Certification. The second track is for general pediatricians and other medical professionals. It focuses on abusive head trauma, child sexual abuse and the courtroom experience.

Chicago provides a beautiful setting for PREP:ID with its bustling city streets adjacent to parks and Lake Michigan. There is plenty to see and do, including Navy Pier with 50 acres of shops, parks and restaurants; an array of museums; and Millennium Park, which features gardens, architecture and a digitally animated fountain.

PREP:ID also is designed for the generalist and specialist. Session formats include question-and-answer sessions, case vignettes and panel discussions.

Those who attend PREP:CAP can earn up to 30.25 AMA PRA Category 1 credits, while those attending PREP:ID can earn a maximum of 39 AMA PRA Category 1 credits.
