### Futon bunk beds

**Units:** About 30,000

**Hazard:** Children can get trapped when the futon and its metal frame are lowered from the seated to the flat position or get stuck in the space between the last rung on the bunk bed's ladder and the futon mattress.

**Incidents:** A 3-year-old boy died when his head and neck became trapped in the bunk bed.

**Description:** The metal futon bunk beds have an upper bunk designed to hold a twin mattress. The bottom bunks have a convertible futon bed.

**Sold by:** Big Lot stores from January 2009 through April 2010 for \$200.
