**Fernando J. De Castro, M.D., FAAP**, of Ironton, Mo., died May 8 at age 74.

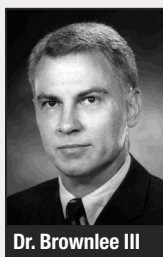
**Niilo Hallman, M.D., Honorary FAAP**, of Helsinki, Finland, died Jan. 13, 2011, at age 94.

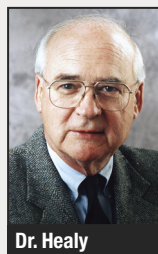
**David L. Rimoin, M.D.**, California Chapter Affiliate, of Beverly Hills, Calif., died of pancreatic cancer May 27 at age 75.

**Jean Pakter, M.D., FAAP**, of New York, died May 22 at age 101. She was the first female pediatric intern at Mt. Sinai. From 1960 to 1982, she headed the New York City Department of Health's bureau of maternity services and family planning, where she influenced the *Roe v. Wade* decision to legalize abortion, created guidelines for hospitals and abortion clinics, and changed how hospitals care for premature infants.
