



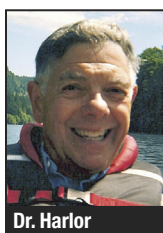

In Memoriam

Dr. Harlor, Oregon Chapter president

Allen “Buz” Harlor Jr., M.D., FAAP, of Eugene, Ore., died of metastatic bladder cancer Feb. 4 at age 76.

Remembered for child health advocacy efforts on national and local levels, he was chair and a member of the AAP Council on Government Affairs (1990-'96). Dr. Harlor also was a member of the Committee on Practice and Ambulatory Medicine, Section on Senior Members Executive Committee and Council on Communications and Media. He was co-author of AAP statements and secretary of the Chapter Forum Committee. He was a member of the Medical Home Chapter Champions Program on Asthma Project Advisory Committee, and served in numerous chapter roles, including Ore-

gon Pediatrics Society president (1984-'86).

Dr. Harlor practiced clinical pediatrics in Eugene from 1966 until retiring in 2012. He was medical division chief of Sacred Heart General Hospital and a clinical instructor in pediatrics at the Oregon Health Sciences University.

After earning his M.D. from Ohio State University, he completed an internship at Milwaukee County Hospital and pediatric residency training at Children's Hospital in Columbus. He served as a pediatrician in the U.S. Air Force at Hill Air Force Base (Utah) from 1964-'66.

Skiing and fishing were among his hobbies. He is survived by his wife, five children and 11 grandchildren.
