Visit Virginia for CME, holiday festivities in historic setting

There's no better time than the holiday season to visit historic Williamsburg, Va. Pediatricians can do just that by attending the Practical Pediatrics continuing medical education course, Dec. 13-15.

Spend a weekend enjoying the festive lights, exploring Jamestown and walking through Williamsburg, the largest living history museum in the United States. Holiday festivities abound, with historic colonial traditions featured throughout the oldest and wealthiest of England's 18th century colonies.

Practical Pediatrics is replete with hot-topic discussions, opportunities to talk with expert faculty and interactive, case-based sessions all geared toward pediatric health care professionals. The Williamsburg conference covers allergy and immunology, dermatology, gastroenterology, infectious diseases, psychiatry and sports medicine.

- "Overuse Injuries in Children" and "Sports Concussion in Young Athletes," with Andrew J. M. Gregory, M.D., FACDM, FAAP, of Vanderbilt University Medical Center;
- "Pimples Galore: Management of Teenage Acne" and "Pustule, Vesicle or Scale? Superficial Skin Infections in Children," with Kim-



berly Horii, M.D., FAAP, of Children's Mercy Hospital; and

- "Assessment and Treatment of Anxiety and Depression in the Black Box Era" and "ADHD: Update on Recent Developments," with Christopher K. Varley, M.D., of University of Washington School of Medicine.

The faculty also offer concurrent lectures that delve into more detail on similar topics, including:

- "Name That Rash: Common Pediatric Dermatology Diagnoses," with Dr. Horii;
- "Food Allergy," with Dr. Smith;

- "Pediatric Psychopharmacology Overview," with Dr. Varley.
