The U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) has announced the recall of the following products. Consumers should stop using recalled products unless otherwise instructed. Consumers can submit reports of harm to CPSC's new searchable online product safety database at www.SaferProducts.gov. A searchable food and medical product recall database is available at www.fda.gov/Safety/Recalls/default.htm.

Children's lamps

Units: About 3.5 million (This recall expands the number and types of lamps and includes IKEA children's lamps from a December 2013 recall.)

Hazard: Children can get entangled in the electrical cord, posing a strangulation hazard.

Description: Recalled are IKEA children's wall-mounted lamps sold in various style names, shapes and colors. The lamp's cord is 7 to 8 feet long with a switch on the cord or a switch on the lamp. Sold exclusively at: IKEA stores nationwide, in IKEA's catalog and at www.ikea-usa.com from May 1984 to April 2014 for \$5 to \$30.

Remedy: Remove the lamp from the wall and contact IKEA for a repair kit. Do not use the lamp until the repair kit is installed.
