The U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) has announced the recall of the following products. Consumers should stop using recalled products unless otherwise instructed. Consumers can submit reports of harm to CPSC's new searchable online product safety database at www.SaferProducts.gov. A searchable food and medical product recall database is available at www.fda.gov/Safety/Recalls/default.htm.

Girls' coats

Units: About 1,700

Hazard: The coats have a drawstring tie sewn into the side seam at the waist that could become snagged or caught in small spaces or vehicle doors.

Description: Girl's "Sugarfly" brand pea coats are double breasted and made of wool and polyester. They are sold in black, charcoal plaid and purple plaid in girls' sizes S (7-8), M (10-12), L (14) and XL (16). Style number KEM236 is on the label found inside on the side seam. "Sugarfly" is printed on a label sewn into the neck of the coat.

Sold at: Nordstrom Rack nationwide from October through November 2010 and online at www.Zulily.com from September through November 2013 for about \$40.

Remedy: Remove the tie from the side seams of the coat to eliminate the hazard, or return the coat to the place of purchase for a refund.
