### Conundrums in pediatrics addressed at Labor Day weekend course

Looking for fresh ways to help patients with attention-deficit/hyperactivity disorder, adolescent health issues and other perplexing problems? Consider Practical Pediatrics Sept. 4-6 at the Renaissance Chicago.

Subject areas addressed include adolescent health, allergy and immunology, dermatology, developmental and behavioral pediatrics, gastroenterology and orthopedics.

Half-day sessions combine continuing professional development with relaxation and recreation. Take a break from learning to explore the Magnificent Mile Shopping Festival, Jazz Festival, North Coast Music Festival and the African Festival of the Arts. Fireworks cap off the night at Navy Pier, where there is plenty for families to explore.

The course combines lectures, interactive seminars and question-and-answer sessions to allow time to interact with faculty. Course highlights include:

- “GERD: The Answers to Your BURNING Questions,” “The Art of Gastroenterology, Painting a Clinical Picture,” “Functional GI Disorders: When Their Belly Pain Gives You a Headache” and “Constipation and Encopresis: From the ‘Poopy Dance’ to the ‘Quick Step,’” with Jonathan E. Teitelbaum, M.D., FAAP;



- “Late Talker or Language Delay?” “Identification and Treatment of Autism Spectrum Disorders: Controversies and Common Ground,” “Psychopharmacology Update” and “Complex ADHD: Beyond the Basics,” with Michelle M. Macias, M.D., FAAP;
- “Female Athlete Triad,” “Consent and Confidentiality on Adolescent Health Care,” “Marijuana Use in Adolescents and Potential Issues Related to Legalization” and “Long-Acting Reversible Contraception (LARC),” with Paula K. Braverman, M.D., FAAP; and
- “Back Problems in Children and Adolescents,” “Splinting and Taping,” “What Pediatricians Need to Know About Fractures” and “Normal Variations of the Lower Extremity in Children,” with William A. Phillips, M.D., FAAP.
